Your Holiness Pope Leo XIV,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

On behalf of the World Council of Churches (WCC) and the global fellowship of churches we represent, we wish to convey our heartfelt greetings and congratulations to you and the whole Roman Catholic Church at your election as the new Bishop of Rome, the Pope Leo XIV.

This moment marks not only a new chapter in the leadership of the Catholic Church but also a renewed opportunity for deepening the bonds of ecumenical friendship and cooperation. We recognize with gratitude the enduring legacy of Pope Francis, who through the synodal way championed a vision of the Church as a community of listening and dialogue, walking together in the Spirit. His commitment to opening the Church to the voices of the marginalized and fostering a culture of encounter has inspired Christians across traditions.

As the Catholic Church continues to harvest the spiritual, theological, and pastoral fruits of the synodal way—deepening the culture of discernment and dialogue—we pray that you as the new Pope will further this rich heritage. We trust you will nurture a Church attuned to the voice of the Spirit and committed to building bridges that transcend confessional and cultural boundaries. Your words in your first speech were a very encouraging expression of exactly this will. The WCC stands ready to continue walking alongside with you as with our Catholic sisters and brothers in this pilgrimage, confident that the Holy Spirit will guide and sustain our shared vocation toward unity in the love of Christ.

May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you as the newly elected Pope Leo XIV as you assume this vital ministry for the life of the Roman Catholic Church, the broader Christian community, and the world.

We look forward to meeting with you in the near future as we have met with previous Popes.
